## **Preparation of papers**

File formats: \*.doc or \*.docx Font: Times New Roman, 12 pt

Alignment: left

Bolds & italics: titles, chapters and references (see example below)

Tabulators: 1 cm

Tables & figures: usual formats, titled and numbered, within the plain text

**Structured abstract:** brief information on study (i.e. background, purpose, methods, the most important results, conclusion).

**Full-text:** "classic" structure in case of research studies – introduction (background), main purposes/aims, methods/sample, results, discussion, conclusion, acknowledgements, and references. Non-research articles (i.e., philosophical, descriptive, methodological etc.) are also possible to submit.
